The idea for a Children's Museum in Laredo began in the 1980s as the late Cecilia Martinez Claflin, curator for the Nuevo Santander Museum, saw the need for a place where children learn with hands-on experiences versus the traditional exhibit behind glass model. She researched the concept together with a group of educators and concerned citizens established goals that would determine the direction and feasibility of such a museum. The museum incorporated on November 26, 1990 and applied for and received a 501c (3) non-profit educational institution status. The Laredo Children's Museum officially opened its doors on September 11, 1991.

At the heart of our operations is a simple goal: to provide opportunities for children and families to engage in the creative process when learning about the world around them. The exhibits we host and the daily programs we present underscore our philosophy that creativity and critical thinking spark the curiosity necessary to become a lifelong learner and develope in children the skills they need to tackle the complex problems they will face in the next century.

The Imaginarium of South Texas is Laredo's only children's museum and informal science center, and continues to provide exhibits and programs that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics (STEAM).

In the 14 years since relocating to Mall Del Norte in February of 2007, the Imaginarium of South Texas has welcomed over 500,000 visitors to its facility. We are so grateful to our community, patrons, and generous donors for helping the Imaginarium of South Tecas continue to grow and develope into an exciting experience for kids and families.



Brackitz Station—Brackitz inspire imagination and creativity with their unique, connect-anywhere planks. Children can create 3D structures that can range from small to big, simple, and complex using the Brackitz station!






2021 Programming

and personal creativity.




